The Community of Online reDesigners (CORD)

The Community of Online reDesigners (CORD) is a collaborative, 10tomonth program focused on the redesign of online courses using the Quality Matters rubric. During CORD, participating faculty attend monthly Community of Practice meetings led by the Director of Distance Learning. Faculty take an in-depth look at the 8 QM standards, implement the standards in their courses, and make revisions after receiving helpful recommendations from reviewers. Final courses become sharable templates and the faculty become DL Lead Course Designers for the college.

- Participants will be introduced to the structure of the CORD program and how it can be used to improve the quality of online courses at their college.
- Participants will also hear from a faculty member who participated in the program and redesigned her course using the QM Rubric. Lessons learned and best practices will be shared.
